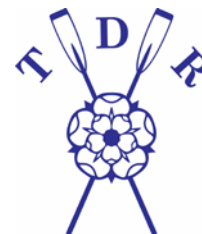


THAMES DITTON REGATTA – Saturday 14th May 2022



ACCIDENT PLAN A

In the event of an accident involving competitors or officials occurring **ON THE RIVER**. The **designated casualty landing places** are as follows: -
(also see course map):

- **ALPHA** – The hire boat moorings, 100m downstream of Hampton Court Bridge (Barge walk, Hampton Court Palace)
 - **BRAVO** – Kingston Grammar School Boathouse, East end of Palace Gardens, Thames Ditton (end of Aragon Avenue, off Summer Road KT7 0PY)
 - **CHARLIE** – Public slipway behind Ye Olde Swan (off Summer Road KT7 0QQ)

Emergency actions

1. THE NEAREST REGATTA OFFICIAL SHOULD IMMEDIATELY TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION TO ENSURE THAT:

- A. Rescue and/or First Aid (if appropriate) is commenced as soon as possible
- B. Further accidents are prevented

This action will include:

- Alert the Regatta's Rescue and First Aid organisation
- Commence the task of rescue and then ensuring provision of whatever assistance may be requested by the person assuming command of the rescue
- Co-ordinate other officials to assist with marshalling competitors and casualties to a place of safety

2. THE LEADER OF THE FIRST REGATTA RESCUE TEAM TO REACH THE INCIDENT SHOULD ASSUME COMMAND OF THE RESCUE UPON ARRIVAL

This action will include:

- Make an immediate assessment of the situation and decide if more assistance is required
- Report that assessment to the Regatta's Rescue and First Aid organisation including a description of any response that may be required
- Co-ordinate and direct that response
- Decide, in consultation with the Safety Adviser, if any casualty(s) should be removed to the **designated casualty landing place** or to any other place
- Decide if any other Rescue Unit should be brought to the scene
- Indicate if the public emergency services should be called

3. ALL OTHER REGATTA OFFICIALS SHOULD IMMEDIATELY TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION TO ENSURE A CO-ORDINATED RESPONSE IS TAKEN TO THE TASK OF RESCUE

This action will include:

- Ensure that all competitors, officials and members of the public comply with the directions given by the person assuming command of the rescue
- Take sympathetic steps to prevent panic or hysteria

- Ensure that further accidents are prevented
 - Relay information to the Regatta's Rescue First Aid organisation in a calm and controlled manner

ACCIDENT PLAN B

In the event of an accident involving competitors or officials occurring **ON ANY AREA OF LAND** occupied or used by the Regatta Organisation.

Emergency Actions

1. THE NEAREST REGATTA OFFICIAL SHOULD IMMEDIATELY TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION TO ENSURE THAT:

- A. Rescue and/or First Aid (if appropriate) is commenced as soon as possible
- B. Further accidents are prevented

This action will include:

- Alert the Regatta's Rescue and First Aid organisation
- Commence the task of rescue and then ensuring provision of whatever assistance may be requested by the person assuming command of the rescue
- Co-ordinate other officials to assist with marshalling competitors and casualties to a place of safety

2. THE LEADER OF THE FIRST REGATTA RESCUE TEAM TO REACH THE INCIDENT SHOULD ASSUME COMMAND OF THE RESCUE UPON ARRIVAL

This action will include:

- Make an immediate assessment of the situation and decide if more assistance is required
- Report that assessment to the Regatta's Rescue and First Aid organisation including a description of any response that may be required
